Marginal ridge thin, abruptly elevated, running parallel with the border and overhanging it. Within the marginal ridge the surface is slightly depressed, with two nearly vertical thin ridges in the anterior half and two curved ones in the posterior. The latter unite at their ends and enclose a crescent-shaped concave space, the outer curve of which is almost parallel with the curve of the posteroventral margin. These curved ridges often extend to and unite with the marginal ridge, and sometimes the upper end of the inner of the two anterior ridges is swollen and forms a more or less prominent node. Dimensions of a large valve: greatest length, 1.55 mm.; greatest height, 0.87 mm.; greatest thickness of single valve, 0.32 mm. The Ohio specimens are usually a...
